General admission is great for the younger fans who have time at their disposal to wait in line for hours. I thought it was great 8 years ago when I saw Depeche Mode at the Birmingham NEC. I stood right in front of Martin for two hours, which was a dream come true! However, now that I am 27, married with a 4-year-old son and have a day job, I find general admission disappointing as I just don't have the time available to stand in line for hours before a show for a good seat. Many of the people I waited with today felt the same way as we have been

fans of Depeche Mode for 15-17 years and have grown-up with them. We are still, if not more devoted to Depeche Mode than ever before. Thanks for letting me vent!

The 23rd of July was a remarkable day, not only for the fact that we celebrated Martin's birthday, but also for the greatest news of the past 17 years - Depeche Mode



I would like to thank you for Bong 37 and share my opinion with you about the latest Depeche Mode releases and the tour.

"Only When I Lose Myself" is a continuation of the style from "Ultra", providing interesting synth links, expressive, deep and vibrating vocals and the strings that can be heard in many of Martin's recent compositions. Subsonic Legacy Remix is a bit darker and its effects remind me of some of the "In Your Room" remixes, featuring a long intro with strange voices, drums, mixed guitar and elements of piano which later develop in Automator Mix. The new video is also very interesting bringing some new components to Depeche Mode image and shows us some of the ideas hidden in the songs (the car hanging in the air over the road!!!). "Surrender" is a slower piece and contains great anxious vocals and guitar. "Headstar", to me, sounds like it's taken out of 'The X-Files' and is full of electronic gadgets, being the most rockiest piece on this single, while Luke Slater Remix seems to be the first Depeche Mode techno track. The sleeve is totally different than the ones used on the other projects. I'm not convinced if it suits the Depeche Mode style, but certainly it is something new. All in all, I like this single a lot, because it has a special atmosphere of an EP, offering us a variety of styles.

I want to say a big 'thank you' to Mart, Dave, Fletch and Christian, Peter, Jordan and Janet for a brilliant concert in Berlin!! The show was absolutely amazing and I am sure I will remember it for a lifetime. Thank you also to the local promoter for great organisation of this event and to all the fans for an unforgettable atmosphere!!

The Videos 86>98

The new video compilation coincided with the release of "The Singles 86>98" at the end of September. It opens with an intro from the Band and the video director Anton Corbijn discussing their experiences from various video shoots, including some rare video out-takes, followed by clips of all the videos released in the period 1986-98. The video concludes with a short film featuring exclusive interview footage with Depeche Mode, which was used previously only as an electronic press kit, and was never commercially released.

You may have noticed that the video clip for "Condemnation" which was originally shot in Hungary, was replaced by the "Devotional" live version, and "Everything Counts" (live) was taken from the "101" video.



The Singles 81>85


The re-release of the first singles compilation "The Singles 81>85" shouldn't be missing from the collection of any Depeche Mode devotee, as all 17 tracks have been digitally re-mastered and have superb sound quality. It features a completely re-designed booklet, in-keeping with this years image, and the inclusion of two bonus remixes of "Just Can't Get Enough" (Schizo Mix) and "Photographic" (Some Bizzare Mix).

The Remixes 81>85

Mute has released a promotional CD and vinyl, featuring four remixes of the early songs: "Just Can't Get Enough" (Schizo Mix), "Get The Balance Right" (Combination Mix), "Master And Servant" (Slavery Whip Mix) and "Everything Counts" (In Large Amounts). The catalogue numbers of these have changed from the ones printed in Bong 37 to PLCDMUTEL1 for CD and P12LMUTEL1 for vinyl.

Promotion

During the European leg of the tour, Depeche Mode held four press conferences in Barcelona, Paris, Copenhagen and Berlin. All were very well received by international journalists, and by the other media people who attended these events.

Upon arrival in the US, the Band were invited on to the David Letterman show where they performed "In Your Room". The show was broadcast in the US on CBS on November 2nd.

Depeche Mode were approached by MTV to do a special programme called '120 Minutes'. Apparently, it was a lot of fun to do and the show was broadcast on November 8.

The music station MTV Europe aired a half an hour special on November 16 featuring a live performance by Depeche Mode, which was recorded in Cologne on October 5. It featured "A Question Of Time", "Only When I Lose Myself", "Enjoy The Silence" and "Personal Jesus". The full hour version of Depeche Mode Live was scheduled for November 26.

'Depeche Mode - Behind The Music' is the title of VH-1's special, produced by Patrick Jager, and featuring interviews with Dave, Martin and Fletch as well as the Band's manager Jonathan Kessler and tour manager Andy Franks. It should also include some live shots from US dates at the beginning of November - so watch out for the date of broadcast!

Anton Corbijn shot some live pictures of the Band during their performances in Stockholm and Manchester, and you can see the result inside this issue.

Depeche Mode were presented with a gold disc award in Riga, Latvia on September 3 to commemorate the sale of "Ultra", the best selling album in Latvia in 1997.

A two page spread on the Band in Helsinki (Sep 9) appeared in the October issue of Q magazine, featuring some brilliant live shots and a short interview with the guys. NME published a whole page on Oct 3, taking an inside look at the DM show in Berlin. The October issue of specialist magazine Record Collector featured a six page spread on Depeche Mode and an extensive list of their commercial and promotional releases, rarities and other memorabilia.

On Tuesday 24th November, Depeche Mode participated in a live video chat on the Internet, from backstage at The Rosemont Horizon in Chicago. This was presented by Jam TV/Rolling Stone Network, in association with Electric Artists, Reprise Records and Mute Records. We would love to hear from anyone who was able to connect to this.

General

The German sports channel DSF proved once again that there must be a big Depeche Mode fan in their crew. Several excerpts from "It's No Good" were featured in a report about the making and producing of DSF's show 'Doppelpass' where German football experts discussed the game and the background of Bundesliga.

"It's No Good" was used on October 9th (UK Channel 4) in an episode of "Friends" when Monica and Phoebe take Chandler to a strip club with lap dancers, in an attempt to cheer him up!

The intro of "Barrel Of A Gun" was used in a trailer for 'Panorama' on October 12th (UK BBC 1). The report was about animal cruelty, serial killers and their links with animals.

"Uselink" was used during a report about cloning on the UK channel Granada in October.

Depeche Mode appeared on the German TV station SAT 1 in a programme called 'Blitz' on Sunday September 20. The programme covered the press conference in Berlin, using various comments from Andy, Martin and Dave. They also played the video of "Barrel Of A Gun" and used some live excerpts from "World In My Eyes". The report concluded with confirmation that all the German shows were completely sold out!!!

NRJ, a French radio station, organised a special weekend (Oct 3-4) dedicated entirely to Depeche Mode. It included new songs, interviews and competitions etc.

"It's No Good" was used on the TV channel TF1 during the French comedy show called 'Combien 'a coute?' which reported about forgery (money, music, paintings...) on October 28.

On November 1, the Norwegian channel TV2 used the intros of "Barrel Of A Gun" and "The Love Thieves" as background music in a programme called 'Gutta pa tur', which means 'Boys on tour'. The program was about boys visiting the Norwegian Navy.

On October 7, the French TV channel TFI broadcast an interview with Dave in a programme called 'Exclusif'. It was recorded only two days before the DM gig in Paris and Dave was talking about his problems with drugs and his new life.

The French TV channel M6 dedicated one hour to DM video-clips on October 1. The same channel also used "Flexible" as background music in a sport report called 'Sport 6' on October 4.

On October 4th the French TV channel TF1's news broadcast a special report featuring live footage and DM interviews.

On September 5th, "Enjoy The Silence" was used in a mix during the evening session with Judge Joules on UK Radio 1.

Depeche Mode were previewed in a programme called 'Buzz' (UK BBC 2) on Sunday 6th September. The report was only brief but covered their career from the very beginning, right up to "Only When I Lose Myself".

On June 28, at the NYC Gay Pride Parade, a Fast Club Mix of "It's No Good" was played in its entirety, which was very well received.

On May 18th, "Uselink" and "It's No Good" were used in a scientific show called 'Les Ecrans du Savoir' on the French TV Channel 5.

Belgian TV channel RTBF is using the United Mix of "Barrel Of A Gun" every day to advertise the movie of the day.

"Waiting For The Night" was used as background music in a programme about a person waiting for a heart transplant. It was featured on the German TV station NDR on August 23.

The whole of "The Love Thieves" was used in 'La Femme Nikita', an extremely fascinating Canadian series based on Luc Besson's successful film, in an episode where the love Nikita yearned for was stolen. It was really touching as the song played while the character went through a difficult time.

It's No Good

It is a recycling of old videos and putting them together. I think it's OK, because it's 'the greatest hits' tour, isn't it? It's only the videos that I've made, there are of course a few others, but they are not in there. As the video screens are upright and as all the old videos are made horizontally because of the TV, that's the only time when the images are a bit small.

Walking In My Shoes

The idea was that people, at many points in their lives, have to make decisions and can also be influenced by things that are important in their life. So, for instance, you have people who in their teenage years want to be Gary Glitter or David Bowie, and that's what the band show. It's on the catwalk so it looks like a show.... think Fletch's Elvis is great! Then there are other things, some trivial, some important, that you decide about - knife, fork, wedding dress, army helmet, etc.

A Question Of Lust

The faces of the band morph into each other and morph into a female body and then back into the faces of the band again. It's a very slow video. It's nice that everything morphs, which is a technical process.

Enjoy The Silence

took some of the elements from the original video, which are the deckchair and the crown. They gradually become graphics and like in a club, they are pulsing on the beat. I think that's really good part of the show.


Barrel Of A Gun

It is a re-edited version of all the stuff of Dave in Morocco. It's very manic and I think it's a brilliant edit, myself. You really get that vibe of someone who is possessed, and obsessed. This video is shown with the mirror ball above it.

Stripped

Here the sexuality is brought into fruits or half cut fruits. It's very simple but it looks very beautiful.


talked about his ideas and intentions during the last week of August - just before "The Singles Tour" hit the road.....

The stage design is what you call low-tech and the stage itself is a bit of an idea that resembles a peep-show, a sexclub or a nightclub, so it's quite intimate and a bit kitschy. Therefore there's a lot of red velvet used on stage to get this vibe. The band is quite close together, only Dave has some space around him and there are some video-screens (like a peepshow) in the middle of the stage. They are not massive screens, and are actually the same height as the lower screens on the last tour. We only use three of them now so people from all the sides can see it and there's the same image on every screen. The images are usually quite clear, but I don't mind if not everybody can see it on this time. It's more of an idea that there is something, it's more of a concept thing. The visuals last time were the show, whereas now it's more part of the whole concept.

The show was going to take the place at Tartu Festival Ground, which is a very nice open-air venue in a beautiful green park. The arena was built a few years ago and its capacity is about 14000 - 16000 people. There were around 14 000 tickets released for this particular show.

We arrived in Tartu at about 11am. We had a bit of walk around the venue, had a meal and then went to the airport to see the arrival of Depeche Mode. We came to the airfield just two minutes before their plane landed. There were about 30-40 fans from Estonian, Latvia, Russia, Sweden, and even Mexico waiting at the airport for this historical moment. The plane landed and the fans went insane - everyone started to scream, yelp, jump etc. The first person who came out of the plane was Andy Franks, followed by Tony (security) and Jonathan Kessler. It went quiet for a while...then suddenly Andy Fletcher appeared at the plane's exit, together with Tim Simenon, Martin, and finally Dave.

Every member of the band took one car and they all went to the venue. We followed them all the way from airport to Tartu Arena.

It was very funny to see six cars with DM and the crew on board, and eight cars with fans in hot pursuit! We reached the entrance of the venue car by car, but were soon split from DM by local security.


After a while we heard Depeche sound-checking "In Your Room" (twice), "World In My Eyes", "Useless", "Home", "A Question of Time" and "Somebody". By that time a lot of fans had already arrived by cars and buses - I noticed three buses from Latvia, one from Lithuania, I also met fans from Germany, UK, Russia, Sweden, Finland and even from the USA! Many of the Estonian fans arrived on a special train called "Johanna" which took people to the concert in Tartu directly from Tallinn. The Estonian Depeche Mode Fan Club (http://edmfk.cafe.ee) had especially decorated it, and there were lots of DM music and videos played during the journey. While everyone was waiting for the gates to open, we explored the "Singles Tour" merchandise. The gates finally opened at 6,30pm and the arena started to fill. All we could see at that moment was an empty stage with three huge boards covered in blue curtains, plus another red one in the background.

The show began exactly at 8,00pm and the support act Purity came on stage.... The sound was terrible and the technicians had big problems with the microphones. It was more noise than the sound of Purity. The crowd, of course, weren't very happy with such a performance and started to shout "Depeche Mode"!!! When Purity left after half an hour, the technicians started to prepare the



stage for Depeche Mode. At the same time Tim Simenon took over the stage and we were in for some of his DJing. Finally at 9,16pm we could hear the first sounds of "Painkiller" and the crowd of 12.000 fans went totally crazy!! During the first beats of the intro the blue curtains were pulled down and two big letters "D" and "M" appeared, as well as a three-part video screen, which began to sparkle.

As the intro was about to finish, two additional musicians (Christian Eigner and Peter Gordeno) appeared on stage followed by Depeche themselves. All of them looked extremely nervous, and no wonder - it was their first show in several years and the beginning of another tour. Dave looked great in his



purple jacket and so did Andy and Mart who wore light sweaters, as it was pretty chilly outside. The band relaxed a bit after the first couple of songs, maybe due to a fact that the crowd was showing an enormous support. At the same time I could see Dave being a bit unsure of what to do on stage, but he soon returned to his famous dancing, movements, and he even tried a mic spin-a-rama during "World In My Eyes". Well, it wouldn't be the first show without a few "oopses". So we forgave the technicians for a 40-second delay after Martin's mic broke at the beginning of "Home" and he had to sing without it until it was changed. We also forgave Dave for missing the beginning of "In Your Room" and the little hiccup in the middle of "I Feel You", because the general atmosphere of the show was just GREAT!! The crowd were singing along with every song, jumping, waving together with Dave and enjoying every moment of the night - the most exciting songs of the show being "Never Let Me Down



Again", "I Feel You", "Enjoy The Silence", "Personal Jesus" and "Just Can't Get Enough". Every song came as a surprise to everyone as we had no idea about the play-list or what to expect. We didn't even know how many encores the band would play and this all added to our excitement!! I was hoping for "Behind The Wheel" and "Strangelove" to be honest, and although they were not performed I was very pleased with the play-list.

After the show ended we got in our cars and went off to Riga.

Riga (Jurmala)

We arrived in Riga at 6am after a sleepless night in our cars and had to take an hour of sleep before going to Jurmala, which is about 20 km away from Riga. On the highway, we met a column of stage trucks that were also heading for the venue. They were already late for about three hours after being held up on the Estonian-Latvian border. We reached the venue at 9,30am and dropped off our friend Roman Aksenenko, the leader of the Latvian fan club. He had his production assistant pass and started to do work there. We all went back to Riga to find out what was going on in Radisson SAS, the hotel where the band were staying. All day long we were receiving permanent update's from Roman at Jurmala venue and were reporting back about events in the hotel.

After our arrival in Radisson, we met Andy who was coming back from his morning run and so we exchanged some opinions on the last night's show in Tartu. He said he liked the sound, the venue, and appreciated the crowd's support. After that, we talked to a sound engineer and some technicians. They were a bit upset about the technical problems in Tartu, but at the same time very optimistic about the forthcoming shows. Someone also

mentioned that it was too cold last night and it wasn't very easy to sing and perform. We also managed to see Dave, but he looked extremely pre-occupied, and so we didn't get a chance to speak with him. At about 3pm, Martin went out to take a walk in the old town along with Tim, Christian, Peter and Tony (the security), who arranged a quick autograph session for us. Thanks ever so much, Tony!! We chatted for a while, Martin and Tim were very relaxed and friendly. As soon as Martin returned from his sightseeing tour the band went to Jurmala venue for the sound-check. We also decided to leave and when we arrived in Jurmala there were already a lot of fans waiting in front of the doors. All 5500 tickets were sold very quickly, in only three days!!

There was a meet & greet organised for the Latvian fans who had won a competition on the local radio station, a few minutes before the show started. Mr. Arvids Murnieks, the Mute representative in Latvia, used this opportunity to present the band with a golden disc for "Ultra", the best selling album in Latvia for 1997.

The show took place in a big metal hangar called Lielupe Tennis Hall. Due to a lack of ventilation in the venue and fans smoking on the ground - it got extremely hot and humid soon after the show began. However this didn't seem to bother any of the fans because everyone was already enjoying the show. Martin was wearing his silver overalls, but Dave and Fletch had more conventional outfits. Unfortunately, the sound was even worse than in Tartu as the venue was like a big metal box creating a huge echo. The playlist was exactly the same as in Tartu and the band members looked more relaxed than on the previous night. Dave was smiling a lot, dancing, spinning and walking around the stage. The crowd was singing along to every song, waving with Dave during "Never Let Me Down Again" etc. Many people already knew that there were only two encores, but the fans were calling for Depeche Mode again and again!! I must say that I really enjoyed this show despite the hot air in the venue.

When the concert finished, we went to an after-show party, but I had to leave soon to catch my coach to Tallinn. Next day, the Latvian fans went to the airport to say 'good-bye' to Martin, Andy and Dave, while I was about to leave for the other gigs in Moscow and St. Petersburg. That's the story.... and life goes on. See ya all!!
