



I would like to congratulate the band on the new album "Ultra". They have done it again! They have released an album which is their greatest work to date, and has kept me gripped from "Barrel Of A Gun" to "Insight" (and of course track 12) over the many times I have so far listened to it.

Every track has been thoroughly thought out in both musical and lyrical composition and is filled with what I'm sure will turn out to be classic Mode songs. The band has got the balance between using guest musicians and performing themselves spot on.

I read interviews with the band prior to the release in which they stated that recording the album had been a much less stressful experience than on previous occasions (in particular "Songs Of Faith And Devotion") and this is obvious throughout the recording.

Unfortunately, I have also read interviews by reviewers (in particularly one from The Times newspaper) in which DM are slagged off because the songs on "Ultra" are not like "Just Can't Get Enough" or "New Life" and the record is nothing but depressing rubbish. "Ultra" has surprised me by its mood because when I heard the album for the first time I found it too depressing. It took me ten listens before I felt I like this record very much. Now let me tell you my opinion on what is so special about this album.

"Barrel Of A Gun" is very innovative and the most dynamic song on the album. But I think it would sound rockier if they used a lot more real drums rather than synths.

"The Love Thieves" - very good slow song. Listening to it is like sailing through a sea of music. Nice synths and atmosphere.

"Home" is one of the most intriguing songs on "Ultra" and so I was surprised that it was chosen as the third single. Martin's voice is anxious and strong like never before.

"It's No Good" - when I heard this song for the first time I thought it is the best Depeche Mode song I have ever heard. The remixes are very interesting too, especially Speedy J Mix which sounds like The Prodigy.

"Uselink" is a very nice link piece but too short.

"Useless" - this must be Dave's best vocal performance ever, underlined with the great sound of the electric guitar!

"Sister Of Night" - a very dark song with a surprising intro that suggests a dynamic tune but turns into something completely different. In my opinion, this track is very similar to "Waiting For The Night".

"Jazz Thieves" sounds unfinished and is the worst part of "Ultra".

"Freestate" sounds almost as a Country song and reminds me of "Coming Back To You" from "Tower Of Song". In the Bluesy parts of the chorus, the vocal and lyrics sound absolutely amazing - "...let yourself go, let yourself go..." - I can't stop humming!

"The Bottom Line" is a step forward, something new. Maybe a taste of Martin's future creation, with less electronic elements. "Insight" is my second favourite song on this album. The beautiful lyrics together with Dave's voice make me shiver.

All in all, this album is great! Especially Martin's lyrics are more

intriguing on this album then ever before, not to forget Tim Simenon who brought in some very innovative ideas. Now I can't wait to see Depeche Mode playing live!

"Ultra" is Depeche Mode's finest album, a real jewel musically, lyrically, with a magnificent production. Its broad use of various instruments opens new doors to a wide range of sound and heightened concepts. All this added with Dave's enhanced vocals goes to make a truly outstanding album.

"Barrel Of A Gun" with its intense power is a statement that DM are back and stronger than ever. With "Barrel Of A Gun" Dave throttles out the vocals in a mixture of pain, power and frustration, ideal for the concept of this song. "The Love Thieves", talk about chalk and cheese after hearing "BOAG". This song is so laid back and hypnotising. "Home" is full of warmth and security, a sincere ballad. The string arrangement makes for a wonderful epic. "It's No Good", a very typical catchy DM song, probably the most commercial song on the album. "Uselink", it's great hearing Daniel Miller performing on this instrumental. The sound is very reminiscent of DM's early '80s tunes. "Uselink" would make a great intro for a DM live show which brings me to "Useless" that would make the perfect song to start a live show following the "Uselink" intro. "Useless" is a very dominating song and lyrically very self-observing of both the singer and the songwriter. "Sister Of Night" is all in one a beautiful, painfilled, heart-felt ballad, which wraps itself around the listener, surrounding them with an irresistible aura. "Jazz Thieves" is like a soundtrack to a film about a serial killer. Imagine the killer stalking a young woman through the streets of NY at night, while you listen to this dark instrumental piece. "Freestate" is all about freedom of mind and spirit. The Western style guitar twanging sets the mood of this song, rather catchy and deeply meaningful at the same time. "The Bottom Line", this second Gore vocal is a beautiful song, with very slick use of the bass. The pedal steel guitar is put to very effective use and there are plenty of dark twists in the song, take the hymn like chanting! "Insight" has a very ritual feel to it. It's concept is one of spiritual journey, a dark yet uplifting experience, the perfect song to end a perfect album!

Congratulations to Depeche Mode! The seven month old "Ultra" has sold nearly 3,000 000 copies and gone gold in US, Germany, UK, France, Canada, Spain, Sweden, Brazil, Belgium, Denmark, Czech Republic, Hong Kong and platinum in Italy.

The singles from the album were not far behind...."Barrel Of A Gun" reached No. 1 in four countries (Czech Republic, Sweden, Hungary and Spain), "It's No Good" topped the charts in five countries (Czech Republic, Sweden, Italy, Denmark and Spain), "Home" reached No. 1 in Czech Republic and Italy.

In the United States, "Useless" was released as a Double A-side with "Home" on November 18th. There are four formats of this single but don't worry there are no new remixes! Here is the line-up so you can check for yourself:

Dave is planning to spend the week before Christmas with his son Jack in London and then spend Christmas and the New Year in New York. Fletch will be staying at home and spending the holidays with his family.



As we said, **Martin** has been very busy lately, writing new songs, and the band could be in the studio as early as the New Year, working on a handful of new songs for inclusion in a double CD package, featuring all the band's hits since 1986. This package doesn't have a title yet, but it could be released late next summer.

The band are also considering touring in the Autumn of 1998.



Depeche Mode were nominated in two categories - Best Act and Lifetime Achievement - for the 'Viva Echo Awards 1997' on August 14th in Cologne.

Reprise Records, the US label that represents Depeche Mode in America, has released a promotional DVD (Digital VideoDisc) that contains the video for "Barrel Of A Gun" along with 18 other Reprise acts. The catalogue number is PRO-DVD-8825.

Following the information in Bong 33 about the Roxy Music tribute album featuring Dave's vocal on "A Song For Europe", here, as promised, are some more details about the project. "Dreamhome Heartaches... Remaking, Remodelling Roxy Music" is the full name of the tribute album. John Taylor (Duran Duran), the executive producer and Hein Hoven, the producer are the men behind the project. The album was released at the

We've just found out that there is a Depeche Mode Tribute Album being put together by a US label called 1500 (a Polygram company). The compilation "For The Masses" (please note that this title has still not been confirmed) is a joint venture between Polygram and A&M, and is planned for Worldwide release early next summer. 1500 Records informed us that some of the tracks have already been submitted, but they are still trying to confirm a couple more major artists. The artwork apparently features a shot of the desert taken by Martyn Atkins who has done various album covers for Depeche Mode in the past. end of September on a small label B5 Atomic supported by the charity Children's Hospital Los Angeles - High Risk Youth Program. This charity is a comprehensive program, which aids homeless and wayward youths in LA and has been studied by other hospitals Worldwide as a model program. "A Song For Europe" is available via 'EMOD', which is a new method of selling music on the net and introduced by The Rocktropolis, allowing the customer to digitally download onto his hard drive a song or an entire album for a fee.

You may have already noticed that a snippet of a video featuring Dave singing with the University of California Church Choir was used on the Band's official web site. Apparently, it was recorded a few months back by Jonathan Kessler's girlfriend Stacie, during one of the choir's weekly performances that Dave was invited to by Evelyn Halus (Dave's vocal coach during the recording of "Ultra") and her husband, who is the Musical Director of the Choir. Dave was asked to sing a duet with someone called Camilla - which, of course, he did.

General

A German TV channel Pro 7 used "Insight" to promote a thriller called 'Bodychemistry' on 7th August.

On May 30th, Depeche Mode were one of three artists featured on ABC's Channel 6 Friday Night Show 'In Concert' (USA TV). The other two were INXS and Erasure. The show featured video clips of "Barrel Of A Gun" and "It's No Good". They also played part of "Useless". There were also interviews with all three members of the Band.

"Uselink", "The Love Thieves" and "Sister Of Night" were used in a sports car show called 'Turbo' on a French Channel M6.

"Never Let Me Down Again" appeared briefly during 'Party Monster' (UK Channel 4) on August 18. The film tells the story of New York club king Michael Alig and his rise to fame following the murder of a drug dealer in 1996. The track was played as Alig attempted to leave New York.

The satellite music channel VH-1 has been using an extracts from "Walking In My Shoes" and "In Your Room" videos for a self-promotion during breaks. I could also hear "Walking In My Shoes" (Ambient Whale Mix) in the background.

Have you noticed? There are lots of "Ultra" posters around Albert Square in the BBC series 'EastEnders' these days.

On August 1, the French TV channel TF1 used "I Feel You" and "The Love Thieves" during a programme called 'De Plus En Plus'. "I Feel You" was used during a report of the biggest gold mine in the world and "The Love Thieves" was used during an interview with a woman who is the youngest police captain in France.

On August 16, Germany's 'Viva News' used "Sister of Night" as background music.

On July 23, the programme 'Moto-bike' on German Sport TV DSF used about three minutes of "Master and Servant" as background music for a motorcycle test.

"Higher Love" was used during the German TV programme 'Exklusiv - die Reportage' (RTL 2) which, in its July edition, focused on fetishism.

On July 19, "Home" was used during a show called 'Sommer, Sonne, Sat 1' on the German TV station Sat 1.

The opening bars of "New Life" were played during a trailer for the BBC1's 'Match Of The Eighties'. Then during the actual programme, two other Depeche Mode tunes were used. "Everything Counts" was played during a review of the 1981-82 season when Danny Baker talked about all the sponsorship and money being injected into football (...the grabbing hands, grab all they can...) also "Just Can't Get Enough" was played during the night.

"It's No Good" was used on July 10, in Germany, during the ARD TV series called 'Verbotene Liebe'.

The satellite music channel VH-1 used 'Painkiller' in a (UK) show called 'Jobson's Choice' as background music during an interview with a female designer, after which the video for "Master And Servant" came on.

On August 2nd "Barrel Of A Gun" was used as background music for the MTV 'US Top 20'.

Erasure's latest single "Rain" was released on November 24th. The specially-priced CD and double 12" contain mixes by Jon Pleased Wimmin, John "00" Flemming (updating Erasure's 1987 hit "Sometimes"), Blue Amazon, Dekkard and BBE, with the CD also featuring three live tracks and the previously unreleased song "First Contact".

Currently in the studio with Flood Barry Adamson is mixing his new album, which is due for release early next year.

The culmination of Mick Harvey's project to transform the songs of Serge Gainsbourg into English is called "Pink Elephants" and was released in October. "Pink Elephants" is a collection of precious odds and ends bound by the presence of many of Gainsbourg's most important and best-loved songs.

Among the busiest Mute acts who completed their tours recently are Erasure (South America and Scandinavia), Nick Cave (Australia), Diamanda Galas (Europe) and Moby (USA)....just so you know.



Like some even despise the first single from "ULTRA", In my opinion "Barrel Of A Gun" is one of the best pieces ever composed by Martin (on the same level as "Never Let Me Down Again", "Fly On The Windscreen" and "Stripped"). It points out the characteristic ingredients of Martin's high songs – slow and enthralling groove, deep lyrics and dramatic atmosphere.

It's a pity that some fans expect only 'electro-pop' from such a high songwriter. On the other hand, I felt a little disappointed with "It's No Good" which I found a bit light and pandering, as well as being out of the "ULTRA" context, like it was an advertising interference! It's video however, partly contributes to saving the situation, since it shows images that are ironical and trashy.

Personally I'm very inspired by "Ultra" and I think the album is the most mature piece of work to date.

It was really interesting to hear some criticism about DM and "Ultra". I can partly understand why some devotees miss songs like "Policy Of Truth", "Never Let Me Down Again" or "Halo" as the memories of these songs and that era are simply unforgettable. But wouldn't it be

boring if Depeche Mode copied themselves on their way. At some point I think the criticism would have been stronger if Depeche Mode created new songs just to remind the people of the 'good old days'.

The songs are very touchy and dreamy. The fans should see "Ultra" as a beginning of a new life for Depeche Mode and yet another step forward and stop comparing it with other earlier albums. "Ultra" is a part of the Depeche Mode history and one of the most moving albums to date.



"Everything Counts" is good for the early 80's and it seems to give a new feel about the song. "Love in Itself" is one of the best videos and it captures the mood very well. "People Are People" (12") this notes the war aspect in the song and takes place on a military type of boat. Seems to repeat quite a lot though. "Master And Servant". Bondage City! Absolutely brilliant, especially Fletch attacking the wall with the road drill! "Blasphemous Rumours" - great mixing from what seems to be the "Live In Hamburg" video. "Somebody" is fantastic, moody, moving video, greatly complimented by Martin's vocals. "Shake The Disease" my favourite Depeche Mode

song. The video is very strange. (Martin playing a corrugated metal door.) "It's Called A Heart" - my favourite video. Mode meet voodoo! What's the TV doing in a field? make a performance like no other front man can do, yet at that time with his still husky voice his energy driven enthusiasm to communicate is flawless, who can ever forget his headband habit on "Told

You So" and his last shout on "Blasphemous Rumours" that sends a chilling path on your soul. Also, what really amazed me is the way Alan, Andy and Martin played there instruments on "Lie To Me" and "Everything Counts", it was so cool...with the drums and percussion trembling down on songs like "Master and Servant" and "If You Want" which undoubtedly only Depeche Mode can do.

"Live In Hamburg" begins with "Something To Do" followed by "Two Minute Warning" and "If You Want". Then there comes "People Are People", the song which made it to their highest chart position in 1984.

The band goes on with two classic singles, "Leave In Silence" and "New Life" followed by "Shame". Then Dave leaves the stage and Martin sings his beautiful ballad "Somebody". While Dave's performance during the whole show is very powerful and full of his classical 'Dave-moves' Martin just walks along the stage. Dave comes back to sing "Lie To Me" and "Blasphemous Rumours", one of my favourite songs especially when it is performed live with Alan and Martin hitting the metal plates. "Told You So" is followed by "Master And Servant", also one of the Band's best

But after some 'Zugabe' the band comes back again to play "See You", "Shout" and one of their most famous songs ever, "Just Can't Get Enough". I bought the ticket for my friend Lene as a surprise birthday present and took her to Wembley Stadium with her suspecting nothing about the events of the evening. As it turned out, both of us were in for a great surprise! We arrived around 7 p.m. - well in time for the football match between Denmark and England Tuesday 15th of May 1990. We hung around the bar, bought a couple of beers and went out to one of the many openings in the stadium wall to look at some of the thousands of people arriving.

We stood near one of the staircase towers looking down at a small group of people, who were standing at the entrance to the tower. One of them was red-haired and I thought he looked a bit like Andy Fletcher. I said this to Lene and she agreed although she wasn't as much into Depeche Mode as I was. Who could the other guy be? Ultra - The Remix Album Format: Unknown Origin: Unknown

The first thing I noticed was the striking cover, similar to the UK CD but everything is white instead of black and a nice photo from sleeve notes is underneath a clear tray on the inside. All songs are in order and the length is a tantalising 70 plus mins. "Barrel Of A Gun" is a dancy but still dark mix which works really well. "The Love Thieves" is almost like an instrumental until it really takes off half way through when Dave takes over. Another excellent mix. Drum beats are well mixed into "Home", again giving a dance feel. Good mix and different but original can't be bettered. "It's No Good" is like an extended version of the original but with some extra dubs and samples. "Uselink" is (wait for it) an amazing 9 1/2 mins long and is actually not bad considering the vast difference in time between the original and the new mix. Just like an extended mix really. New sounds are integrated into "Useless" (a bit like an organ in a church) and still has the strong drum beat throughout. "Sister Of Night" is my favourite mix. Starts off with a hard sound but then goes on to the breakdown of the drums as heard half way through the original. It works brilliantly! Dave then swings in to complete a totally wicked mix. "Jazz Thieves" is very similar to "Uselink". Another extended version but not by as much. There is a very hip-hop feel to "Freestate" that works quite well, although original is far superior. "The Bottom Line" also has the hip-hop swing to it. Beats then become richer when Martin sings. Fits in well though. A brilliant track from "Ultra", the concluding "Insight" is not as good as I had expected and is a bit too dancy for such a class track. The last track titled -'Untitled'! is better known to me and you as "Junior Painkiller", the short hidden piece at the end of "Ultra". Again extended to just over 2 1/2 mins and with quite a few new sounds mixed in with what sounds like someone giving it a few oh's in the background. Interesting! All in all an excellent remix album very well presented visually, very professional with some cracking mixes - 8/10. Highly recommended and well worth £10 I paid for it.

Ultramode Format: 2 CD Origin: Belgium

It states that this is a product of the Belgium based DM Fan Club and a compilation of rare Depeche Mode material gathered over the years. It also supposed to be the first of five releases yet to come. The cover is plain black with the name "Ultramode" written on it in white. On the back, there are two b&w photographs taken at some press conference. The first CD is everything a bootleg should be. It starts with a live recording of Depeche Mode's performance during the French TV show called 'Nulle Part Ailleurs' (21/4/97), featuring "Barrel Of A Gun" and "It's No Good". Then there is a radio edit of "BOAG" and two promotional club remixes previously not available on CD. The third part of this bootleg is a song said to be a David Gahan demo. The sound quality of this song is not that great, but more than interesting, considering the fact that it could be a genuine demo. The fourth part consists of the tracks recorded during the San Francisco gig in 1994 and features the following songs: "Rush" (intro), "I Want You Now", "Somebody", "Question Of Time" and "Personal Jesus" (with a guest appearance by Primal Scream, it seems). The second CD features some "Violator" tracks but they are a bit noisy and mono - but hey, I got it! In my opinion this is the best bootleg compilation to be found at this very moment. I only paid £ 20. You better watch out for it as there are only 30 copies available!

Gold Collection Format: CD Origin: Belgium

Apart from the well-known mixes, this bootleg also contains some interesting ones: "Policy Of Truth" (Arabian Mix), "Personal Jesus" (Brat Mastermix), "World In My Eyes" (Dub Mix), "A Question Of Lust" (Gore Trance Mix), "Never Let Me Down Again" (Western Remix). All these mixes are very professional and although this CD wasn't cheap (I paid £ 14) I consider it to be an interesting recording. If you haven't got any remixes yet, I do recommend this one.

Forbidden Fruits Vol. 2 - Polished Gold Format: CD

Origin: Pain+Love Records, England This is the following CD of the one reviewed in Bong 26. It has the four lads b&w photos of "101" on a blue sleeve. It lasts 80'06" and contains 20 tracks: "Policy Of Truth" (FM Radio Mix), "Behind The Wheel" (FM Radio Mix), "Strangelove" (Blind Remix Edit), "Personal Jesus" (Who Is Jesus Remix), "Master And Servant" (Single Remix), "Route 66/Behind The Wheel" (Megamix No. 2), "Boys Say Go" (Session Version for BBC Radio 1 - 21/06/81), "A Question Of Time" (Phil Harding Extended Remix), "Never Let Me Down Again" (Single Remix), "Walking In My Shoes" (Chris' Original Mega-Sound Remix), "Enjoy The Silence" (Video Mix), "I Feel You" (Cutoff Metal Mix), "Route 66" (Martin L. Gore Acoustic Version), "Route 66" (Dave Allen Remix Edit), "But Not Tonight" (US 7" Mix), "Shake The Disease" (Fade Mix), "Faith Healer" (Radio Edit), "Behind The Wheel" (US DJ Mix), "A Question Of Lust" (One Canal Mix), "Pimpf" (Strict Edit Midi Mix). The sound is very good but there are some mistakes in edition. Even though the sleeve mentions '20 special treatments' there are some swindles: 13 tracks are in fact official versions (official 7" or remixes suddenly cut in the middle of the track!). The 'Acoustic Version' of "Route 66" is in fact the sample that Martin plays in the guitar shop in "101" movie, and the worse goes to the "Pimpf" Mix which is the fade in of "101"!!! I paid £15, which was a bit too much for such a poor compilation. My advice - don't buy it unless you're just starting to collect singles or maxis and don't have the official versions. Don't be fooled buy new titles!






