





The Singles 81>85 + The Singles 86>98


A limited number box set featuring both, "The Singles 81>85" and "The Singles 86>98" was released in France back in December 1999. A hard cardboard box contains the singles albums in their original packaging and the overall design uses some of the

well known images from these albums. It is an official release and is still available from the French on-line music store www.fnac.com



The Singles 86>98

"The Singles 86>98" went platinum in Germany last April. This represents sales



of over 500,000. Although the gold and platinum standards in Germany have recently been reduced to 150,000 and 300,000 respectively, "The Singles" album was released prior to this change, and that is why it seems to have taken so long.

Leave In Silence

The intro and main riff of "Leave In Silence" was used throughout the track called "Tuttincoro" by RAF, the Italian DJ and producer Mauro Picotto. It was approved by Martin in April last year and he is also mentioned in the credits. The record is available on Media Records and the track can also be found on the double mix album "Tranceformer 2000".

Top 300

On January 1st 2nd, the local radio station WLIR - 92.7 (formerly known as WDRE) in New York ran a program showcasing the Top 300 most popular songs. The countdown results were based on airplay, sales, and requests. Depeche Mode can be counted as the second most popular band amongst WLIR listeners with a total of ten songs in the countdown. The Cure came in first with eleven songs, U2 tied with Depeche Mode, and R.E.M. was third. The songs listed for Depeche Mode are as follows (high to low): #9 "Just Can't Get Enough", #34 "Strangelove", #48 "Enjoy The Silence", #63 "Personal Jesus", #86 "Route 66", #113 "Blasphemous Rumours", #132 "People Are People", #152 "Never Let Me Down Again", #191 "A Question Of Lust", #275 "Policy Of Truth". Congratulations to Depeche Mode!

Top 400

One of Australia's well known radio stations Fox FM announced the Top 400 songs as voted in by their listeners back in March...and yes...Depeche Mode came in with "Just Can't Get Enough" at number 47.

General

On February 11, the Portuguese TV Channel Sie broadcast another part of the singing contest called "Chuva de Estrelas" (English version of "Stars In Their Eyes") where the contestants imitate their favourite star. That night, one of them dressed up and sang like Dave in the video of "It's No Good". One member of the jury confessed he also is a Depeche Mode fan!!

A remix of "Useless" was used in its entirety, during one episode of the detective series called "Ochrance" (Protector) on the Czech TV Nova on March 5.

On November 16, MTV America aired a show entitled "Music, Myths and Mysteries", which talked briefly about David Gahan and how he had died for over two minutes. The segment was about musicians who overcame death.

On the morning of March 16, a snippet of "I Feel You" was played on the UK TV Channel BBC 2 Open University program about the digital future.

An interview with Anton Corbijn was shown on 8th and 10th December in a programme called "Musikbyran" on the Swedish TV Channel 1. Anton spoke about his photo gallery in Lund, Sweden and artists he's been working with, but mostly about Depeche Mode (when he first met them, what he thought of them,

what he thinks of them now...). Also, clips of "Barrel Of A Gun", "World In My Eyes", "It's No Good" and the intro of "Strange Too" were shown.

A three hour long special called "Nightfile - Depeche Mode" was broadcast on the Italian TV Channel TMC2 on Sunday 23rd January. It featured many videos, the Band's history, live performances, two interviews with Martin (recorded in Italy in 1990 and 1993) and another one with Dave and Alan (1985) and special artwork by fans.

On January 31, the Danish TV2 showed a programme called "Den kvarte time" (Quarter of an hour). The programme was about the Danish health system. The backing music during the entire program were the instrumental parts of "Home".

The local channel in Zurich called Star TV had a 50-minute DM special on January 13. The programme was called "Egos & Icons" and it featured several excerpts from the "101" video and also parts of the VH1 special. There was also an interview from 1982 with Dave and Martin and another from 1993 with Dave. The special showed the story of DM till 1993.

On January 22, the German TV RTL2 used a part of "Barrel Of A Gun" and "Useless" as background music in the program called BRAVO TV Extra.

The Slovak TV Markiza used excerpts of "I Feel You", "It's No Good", "Personal Jesus" and "It's No Good" (Speedy J Mix) advertising their TV programmes for February.

On February 10, "Painkiller" was used as background music on Danish KANAL 2 in the program called "Extrem". The program was about selecting fighter pilot candidates for the Danish Air Force.

The Swiss radio station DRS 3 broadcast a DM special on February 19. The program was called "Kosmos" and was about music in the 80's etc. The special was approx. 20 minutes long and covered the entire career of DM, in celebration of their 20th anniversary this year. There were snippets from interviews with Martin and Alan; they also played their biggest hits prior to "Ultra". It seems that DRS 3 is a big fan of Depeche Mode, since they are still using "Blasphemous Rumours" as a jingle for the programme "Focus"...and this has been running for years now.

"Surrender" was used during a show called "Envoyé Spécial" on the French TV Channel France 2 in February. The programme was about soccer and money. Also "Behind The Wheel" was used twice in a car show called "Turbo" on the French Channel M6.


On March 10, "It's No Good", "Barrel Of A Gun" and "Walking In My Shoes" were used in the TV game called "Now or Never" on the Dutch TV Station VT4. The game challenges people with phobias about doing certain things or those with particular abilities...the songs were used as background music while a golfer drove the ball, with his club, from one city to another - across streets, woods, fields etc.

On March 11, the intro of "In Your Room" was used as background music during the consumer program called "Kassa" on the Dutch TV Ned. 3. It was used during a report about people who complain about certain things in their houses.

Spending about an hour walking around the centre, we start to think about having some lunch. I suggest several places where we can eat and the choice is made. Andy seems quite happy with it as well....







Dear Bong,







I am now 32 years old and I have been a very big Depeche Mode fan since 1984. Very few can say they have a copy of all 42 Bong Issues and even the newsletters published by the Depeche Mode Information Service before Bong was born, can they? I had a chance to meet the band three times. During the "Devotional Tour", right after the amazing show Depeche Mode performed at the Forest National Hall in Brussels, Belgium on May 25, 1993, I went to the Conrad Hotel where the Band were staying. Some fifteen fans were already waiting there. Anton Corbijn was the first one who arrived. He was taking pictures during the whole evening. Then two black Mercedes arrived at midnight. Martin and Alan ran quickly into the main lobby without a word. Fletch and Dave stopped by the fans and both kindly signed autographs to everyone. Dave seemed a bit exhausted but was very happy with his performance and the reaction of the Belgian crowd that night. Just before another Devo-



tional concert at the Sporthalle in Cologne, Germany on July 22, 1993, I decided to go in front of the Hyatt Regency Hotel. I couldn't see Dave, but Fletch, Alan, Martin and Daniel Miller, who was there for Martin's birthday celebration the following day, arrived at 6pm. They left one hour later and headed for the venue. All four of them were very kind and signed autographs to the fans. I took about twenty pictures of the guys in Brussels and Cologne, but there wasn't one featuring myself with the Band. But most importantly, I managed to get the most valuable item for my DM record collection, which contains 600 records now - a UK promo sample of "Enjoy The Silence" autographed by all four members, Anton Corbijn and Daniel Miller!! During "The Singles Tour 86-98", I was the lucky winner of a competition organised by a Belgian Radio Station called Radio 21. My best friend Charles and myself received the meet and greet passes to meet the

Band prior to the show at the Forest National Hall on September 22, 1998 my tenth Depeche Mode concert since 1985. 


